If you were with us for the Faith Statements of our 2019 Confirmands, you were blessed with these individual, organic statements of faith. Our church serves the Lord in many different ways. We sing, learn, babysit, decorate, cook, paint, and teach, to just name a few. One particular act of service that I would like to highlight this month is our Confirmation program.

Confirmation at Concordia is three and a quarter years long. Beginning in sixth grade, the Confirmation students meet for games, dinner, large group instruction by a pastor, and small group reflection time with a trusted adult. This program includes our All Youth Retreat in the fall, which is a significant part of our overarching ministry. To conclude Confirmation, students read a statement of their faith to the congregation and are publicly celebrated in a worship service.

To make a typical Wednesday night of Confirmation work, we need approximately 40

volunteers each week. Some of these helpers commit to every week and others volunteer periodically throughout the year. By the end of the year, we have thousands of hours donated from our congregation for the betterment of our youth. The gifts of time, talents, and treasures that these families give are noticed and appreciated!

This year, we are celebrating that 37 students have completed our Confirmation program. We rejoice with them and give thanks to God as we look forward to their unique lives of faith. While our Wednesday night helpers are sad to see them go, we are grateful for the time we had with them and look forward to seeing how God will use them in other parts of the church's life.

Our church serves faithfully the Confirmation program and in return the students faithfully serve others. Please continue to pray with me that God would continue to bless this ministry and all the ministries at Concordia. God is certainly good.

TURKEY BLESSING





Concordia Men's Ministry is coming together for the 5th Annual Turkey Blessing to demonstrate Christ's love to those in need in our community. We will distribute 1,000 Thanksgiving dinners on **Sunday, November 24**. The packaged (not cooked) dinner will include a frozen turkey, stuffing, green beans, gravy and potatoes. Each dinner will be sufficient to feed a family of five (1,000 dinners x 5 = 5,000!).

During the distribution of the dinners, faith-filled materials will be placed within each box for adults and children. Our prayer is that these interactions and materials will plant a seed, allowing the Holy Spirit to work in the hearts and minds of those we feed. Most importantly, Concordia's teams will interact with the recipients and pray with them regarding their needs and Christ's love. We are thankful for the opportunity to address hunger in our community; however, it is not really about the turkeys.

This massive undertaking will require a significant number of volunteers. While sharing the story of Christ's blessings in our lives, this project unites the Men's Ministry at Concordia. We estimate we need 200 male volunteers for many different tasks:

- On **Saturday morning, November 23**, from 9:00am-12:00pm, there will be a mandatory meeting and worship. In that service, we will unite as brothers in Christ and receive instructions on performing this project and how to effectively reach out. After the service, there will be a volunteer opportunity to stage the food for distribution.
- On **Sunday, November 24**, distribution begins at 12:00pm and lasts until 5:00pm or until supplies are gone. Some volunteers will be scheduled to arrive at 11:00am to help with staging and preparation.
- This will be a powerful, faith-building experience and opportunity to transform your faith through meaningful action. There will be several volunteer opportunities for this project. The specific volunteer positions are more fully described on the volunteer sign-up webpage.



INBOUND OFFERINGS UPDATE



Last month in the Connection and in our worship announcements, we communicated our offerings were down 10% from last year. In October, we began to see a rebound as our offerings exceeded October 2018 as well as our budgeted expectations. We began October with a shortfall of **\$161,000** over 2019 but ended October with a year to date shortfall of **\$111,000**. Thank you to the generous donors who have stepped up to make a difference. Next month, I will be able to get a target of what we will need to meet expenses for the year. Please know the staff is working hard to manage expenses. We still have a ways to go but are certainly making progress. Thank you!

MANY WAYS TO GIVE

Concordia offers many ways to donate to our ministry. Our members use cash, check, credit cards and bank account transfers to donate.

Primary Ways to Give:

Offering Envelope: Give cash or check and put in offering basket during worship.

Online at CKhome.org. Click on Giving in the upper right corner. You can select to give one time or make your gift recurring.

NOTE: Credit card companies charge us 3%. Bank accounts are very low-cost for us, so we encourage you to set up online donations using your bank account versus credit card. (However, please use what is best for your family.)

Tax-Saving Ways to Give

Donate Stock: Did you know if you donate appreciated stock, you will have no capital gains tax to pay? This is a great way to maximize your gifts to our ministry and save you money at the same time. Concordia has an easy process for donating stock. If interested, contact Kristin Anderson at **kanderson@CKhome.org**.

Donate from Your IRA: If you are over 70 ½ years old, you may donate your Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA directly to Concordia. When you do this, you will avoid paying income taxes on the amount you donate.

iPad kiosk in the Concordia Center Commons: Select "tap to donate" and follow instructions. Enter your email address to get a receipt.



As has been previously communicated, the Sr. Pastoral Call Committee has been hard at work developing a comprehensive plan to ensure a thorough and transparent search process. Since most are probably not familiar with how a call process works, the information below should provide more clarity on what activities the congregation can expect to take place over the coming year.

The Divine Call Process typically takes 12-24 months. We ask that you keep the committee and congregation in your prayers as we together discern God's will and wait for Him to reveal the one He has already chosen as Concordia's next Sr. Pastor.



1. Congregational Assessment & Sr. Pastor Profile: A survey (QR code to the right) will be sent out to all confirmed members of Concordia in November designed to get a sense of our congregation, help us understand areas of our mission and values, and seek thoughts about the direction of pastoral ministry here at Concordia. The results of this survey (both electronic and hard copies will be available) will lead to the development of the pastor profile, which will be shared with the entire congregation.



- 2. Nomination Process: A formal nomination process will take place, which will consist of (a) input from members via a submitted nomination form and (b) assistance from the LCMS to identify candidates who are eligible to receive a call and who may be a good fit based upon the congregational assessment and pastor profile.
- 3. Skills Assessment and Due Diligence: The call committee will review all nominations to identify those candidates that best align with the pastor profile and the values of Concordia. Additionally, the LCMS will work in parallel to surface individuals they believe would meet our needs as well as validate eligibility of nominations submitted by Concordia members. The output of this assessment and due diligence process will yield a focused list of candidates that the call committee will speak with.
- 4. Final Candidate(s) Identification: After the initial screening process, our prayer is that the Lord will lead us to the individual(s) that will shepherd Concordia. Further deep-dive discussions will take place.
- 5. Committee Recommendation & Congregational Assembly Vote: The call committee, with confirmation from the Church Council, will make a formal nomination(s) to issue a call. The candidate(s) shall be presented in a meeting of the Congregational Assembly and voted on by written ballot with a majority vote required to confirm the nomination.

And next summer, the senior youth will have an opportunity to have this same impact on the people on our Senior Youth Mission Trip. Below I have some information about this trip and I hope that you will be as excited to qo as I am!

WHO can go?

Any senior youth currently in high school, or any adult may sign up for this mission trip. Register for the trip at **CKhome.org/hsyouth**.

On Saturday, November 16, the deposit for the Copperhill, Tennessee trip increases from \$100 to \$175. This increase will not count towards your total trip cost. The deadline to register will be on Sunday, November 30.

WHAT will we be doing?

On this trip, we will have the opportunity to reach out and minister in areas where closed businesses and industries have left people with little means to provide for their families, with a focus on home repair and renovation, However, it is the relationships formed with those served that will be remembered forever.

No construction background is needed to help rebuild the community with the love of Jesus Christ.

- Sunday: Travel to camp and participate in opening worship.
- Mon-Wed: Youth will spend the morning and early afternoon on their mission site helping the surrounding community. Afternoons will be spent on camparounds playing sports or participating in other activities the camp provides. Evenings will be spent in worship and devotion.
- Thursday: Spend half the day at a mission site, then spend the afternoon and evening doing camp activities, such as horseback riding, paintball, white water rafting, and mountain biking.
- Friday: Spend the day around camp with the same adventure opportunities as Thursday.
- Saturday: Travel back to St. Louis!

WHERE is it?

We will be staying at Whitewater Camp in Copperhill, TN. Our mission sites will be close to the camp. We will spend our evenings and nights on the campgrounds. You can check out their website at WhiteWaterExpress.com.

WHEN is it?

We will leave on Sunday, July 26 and arrive back in St. Louis on Saturday, August 1.

WHY are we going?

What we are doing is important. But Why we are going on this mission trip is FAR more important! On this trip, it is my prayer that you see the impact you have on others through your service, gain connections with other Christian believers, and grow in your faith.

KIDS IN ADVENT Why do we celebrate Advent?

The word Advent means "coming." During Advent, we prepare for the coming of the One who was born that first Christmas in a stable. We prepare for the One who saved us from sin, death and the power of the devil: our Lord Jesus Christ! What a wonderful and exciting time of preparation!

What is the Advent wreath?

The Advent wreath is the circle of candles that you see in church during the season of Advent. Some Advent wreaths hang from the ceiling of the sanctuary while others are placed on a floor stand like ours. Either way, the Advent wreath is one of the many

beautiful things you'll see at church during Advent.

How do we use the Advent wreath?

It used to be that the Advent wreath was used in the home to help count the four weeks of Advent. Now you can find them in homes as well as in church. Each Sunday in Advent, a new candle on the wreath is lit. For example, during the first week of Advent, only one candle is lit. During the second week in Advent, two candles are lit. We do this to remember and prepare for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ, the Light of the World!

What is the rest of the Advent story?

The Advent of Christ has three parts. God's Word tells us that Jesus not only came to earth as a man at Christmas, but that He also comes to be with His Church through His Word and Sacraments. Finally, God's Word reminds us that He will return in judgement on the Last Day. If you think about it, there sure are a lot of great things to remember and look forward to during the season of Advent!

Not sure how to start an Advent tradition in your own home? Here are some ideas: buy or make an advent wreath, sing favorite Christmas hymns (Away in a Manger; The First Noel; Joy to the World; O Come, O Come Emmanuel; etc.), read an Advent devotion together, read the Christmas story from the Bible (Luke 2, Matthew 1-2), pray together, create your own manger scene with craft supplies, attend Advent worship at 6:45 on Wednesdays!

During Advent, kids get to join in worship together! On **December 4**, **December 11 and December 18**, after dinner, recreation, and a Bible lesson, everyone at KidsNight will attend Advent worship in the Concordia Center to prepare for the One who saved us from sin, death, and the power of the devil.


