

November offerings were ahead of expectations, helping us to narrow the offering gap between 2018 and 2019. We are still **down 4%** over 2018 but that is much improved from the 10% we were down a couple month ago. Thank you, Concordia!

Donate Stock

The stock market is at an all-time high! Did you know that if you donate appreciated stock, you will have no capital gains tax to pay? In addition, your tax deductible contribution equals the market value of the stock on the date of the gift. This is a great way to maximize your gifts to Concordia and save you money at the same time. Concordia has an easy process to donate stock.

Donate from Your IRA

If you are over 70 ½ years old, you may donate your Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA directly to Concordia. When you do this, you avoid paying income taxes on the amount you donate.

Thanks to all who completed the congregational assessment and shared insightful feedback about the current state of Concordia – what is working well, what can be improved or enhanced as well as highlighting the desired characteristics, responsibilities and leadership styles of a new Sr. Pastor.

The results of this survey will help in three critical areas: (1) enabling the call committee to craft the pastoral job description to publish and begin the nomination process early next year, (2) allowing current pastors and staff to use the information to shape the ministry strategy of Concordia in 2020 and beyond and (3) helping potential candidates learn about Concordia along with the aspirational characteristics of the next Sr. Pastor.

Below is a summary of the important themes that surfaced from the collective responses of the congregation.

1. WHAT IS WORKING WELL AT CONCORDIA

- Variety of worship services and times offered
- High quality of the worship music experience
- Congregation is warm and welcoming
- Preaching by current pastors is engaging, practical and tied to Scripture
- Abundance of opportunities to serve
- Strong presence in the community through events like Turkey Blessings and Night to Shine along with the association with CCLS
- Lay leadership, specifically as it relates to the kid's ministry and youth program

2. AREAS TO STRENGTHEN CONCORDIA MOVING INTO THE NEXT STAGE OF MINISTRY

- A more robust Sunday adult Bible study offering and communication of dates/times/leaders
- Additional Bible study offerings outside of core Monday–Friday working hours
- More consistent women's and men's ministry outside of large, cornerstone events
- Stronger engagement opportunities within the following demographics: post-college singles, younger couples w/o children, empty-nesters

3. DESIRED CHARACTERISTICS, RESPONSIBILITIES & LEADERSHIP STYLES OF OUR NEW SR. PASTOR

- Top desired focus task areas: driving future vision and leadership, spiritual formation and discipleship, administration and staff management
- Top desired personality characteristics: outgoing/friendly, confident, transparent, dedicated, optimistic
- A leadership style that is influencing, inspiring, people-oriented and persuasive
- An equipper and developer as opposed to leading from the top down (authoritative)
- A preaching style that is personal, engaging and incorporates personal narratives and real-life scenarios that relate back to Scripture

Holiday season is in full swing and life is getting a little hectic, but life can be chaotic and crazy no matter what holiday is approaching. TEENAGERS NEED MENTORS AND ROLE MODELS

TEENAGERS NEED THEOLOGY

In a connected and global world, your son or daughter is exposed to countless ways of thinking, world-views, and cultures, each one vying for influence on how your teenager talks, acts, behaves, and believes. Youth group is a place for your teen to hear God's purpose for them. It's vital for teens to develop a Christian world-view, so they can go out and share God's love with others.

TEENAGERS NEED A SAFE PLACE TO CONFIDE

We all make mistakes and bad choices. Adolescents who are still learning about life and have a developing frontal cortex make no shortage of mistakes. Your son or daughter needs a place to know they are loved by God and forgiven for ANYTHING they think, say or do. Youth group is a time for them to reflect on their decisions, repent and ask for forgiveness, and gain absolution and assurance that their sins are forgiven.

The holiday season is here and families are busy. The busyness of life does not change when the calendar says January 1, 2020. But it is important for your teenager to come to Super Sunday's, small group gatherings, and servant events. The excitement is building as our Special Needs Ministry Sensory Room dream is quickly becoming a reality here at Concordia!

For the past couple of months, the space once used as the nursery has been transitioning to a space better suited to meeting the needs of children and youth with sensory sensitivities. Half the room will, in fact, be a Multi-Sensory Environment.

A variety of places, from airports to football stadiums, have been installing their own Multi-Sensory Environments. This may cause you to wonder why we would even need a Multi-Sensory Environment, also known as our Sensory Room, at Concordia.

All Sensory Rooms are spaces designed to help individuals with sensory issues and

sensitivities regulate their brain's negative reactions to external stimuli. Children and youth who require this additional sensory input from a Sensory Room are then calm and focused and ready to continue on with their intended activities. Here at Concordia, this means our children and youth with special needs are ready to learn about God!

Now, thanks to this dedicated space, families who once would have been unable to even attempt coming to worship because the trip alone would have been too much for their child with sensory needs can now confidently attend knowing their child will be able to decompress and regulate their senses once they are here.

We have been working with a non-profit organization called The Synapsory to make this dream a reality. Their mission is to help churches reach these families once deemed unreachable through the use of Sensory Rooms.

I encourage you to stop by and take a look as we make progress toward better meeting the physical and spiritual needs of everyone at Concordia!
