Can't find glasses. Realize they are on top of head (face-palm accompanied by falling and now broken glasses. Face-palm part deux).

Realization: Some years ago, I realized that any time was a good time to pray with another, even if it is on the phone (face-palm). This realization was more evident than ever in the days preceding Christmas: praying with members for "minor" surgeries, hallway impromptu prayer, prayer during a "random" (I don't really believe in random encounters) conversation while having a cup of coffee. I even got an invitation through digital media to sign up to be

part of a continuous chain of prayer for a particular need.

Invitation: Any time is a great time to pray! (Face-palm). We invited you to prayerfully consider generously contributing to Concordia in order to meet our mission and ministry obligations for 2019. As of this writing, I can't tell you how well we did.

But (face-palm) I can ask you to pray with me. Here's the idea. Christmas doesn't end on December 31. Five days of the Twelve Days of Christmas are the first five days of January (January 6 is called Epiphany). As we get ready for a January and February sermon series focused on Generosity, would you join me in a 5 day prayer commitment?

You can pray alone. You can pray by phone. You can pray by text. Maybe email is next. (Love Dr. Seuss).

Petition: Thank God for the blessings He has given Concordia. Ask God to bless all of our ministries, especially our new Bible studies and the cultivation of Life-groups. Ask God to give us Holy Spirit-inspired generous hearts. Praise God for our identity as His children.

I am sure there will be many other examples I will think of once this letter goes to print (face-palm). But I am sure you will make up for those deficiencies with your own prayers, petitions and thanksgivings.

CONCORDIA OUTBOUND MINISTRIES

Concordia Outbound Ministries (COM), funded entirely through designated offerings from you (the second line on your envelope), supported many projects, missions and agencies during 2019. Thank you for all the support we were able to provide to the following initiatives:

Christian Education – Supporting Lutheran education for elementary, high school and seminary students. In 2019, this aid supported ethnic immigrants at CFNA attending an area Lutheran School, and Chris Hill and Vincent Kam at Concordia Seminary. **Total Funded: \$15,000**

LCMS at Large – Supporting our denomination at large primarily through the Missouri District. **Total Funded: \$2,542**

Human Care Individual Assistance – Supporting those both inside and outside our congregation who need some immediate financial support for basic needs. **Total Funded: \$560**

DETERMINING FUNDING

To receive funding from COM, organizations or individuals apply each year. The requests are studied and funding is determined by the Concordia Outbound Ministries Committee, who meets 2-3 times per year. The COM Committee several years ago developed Guiding Principles for how we approve requests. Those include:

- We primarily only support organizations/individuals who carry out their mission in the name of Jesus Christ.
- We primarily support organizations where we also serve as a congregation hands and feet follow our dollars.
- We prefer to support organizations rather than individuals, with some exceptions (crisis care and short-term missions).
- Commitments are made between one and three years. They are renewable but never considered to be unending.
- We should not be the critical/primary funding source for any organization/individual.
- We prefer to support fewer organizations with large dollar amounts where the impact can be more meaningful and the story more impactful.
- A mutually accountable relationship should exist between support organizations/individuals and Concordia (e.g., how support impacted lives, hands and feet, need to be able to tell the story, etc.).
- We understand the organization to be sound financially with a future.

Thank you to all who supported Concordia Outbound Ministries in 2019. We look forward to another blessed year in 2020.

SENIOR PASTOR JOB DESCRIPTION CONCORDIA LUTHERAN CHURCH

Purpose

To serve the congregation by providing primary leadership to the ministry of approximately 2,500 Concordia members. This pastor serves as a spiritual leader, visionary and administrator while also empowering, training and equipping other staff and lay leaders toward faith development and service to others in the name of Jesus Christ.

Mission Statement

Touching People with Jesus Christ for Healing and for Service.

Values

We live out our mission through these values:

- Be Still: Life is hectic; church is to be a place to find peace
- Be One: Life is fragmented; Concordia is a place to get reconnected—to God and to others
- Be Faithful: Life is scattered; church is a place to get equipped for putting your faith into action wherever you find yourself

- **Core Value Promoter**: Promote and exemplify the Staff Core Values and ensure they are permeated throughout the congregation.
- Leader Developer: Actively participate in the development of current and future leaders of Concordia in line with Ephesians 4:11-12 and ensure there is an intentional strategy for leadership at all levels.
- **Equipper**: Develop, empower and equip staff and lay volunteers with needed resources to accomplish their ministries, whether financial, strategic or leadership.
- Mission Advocate: Demonstrate a passion for those outside Concordia by encouraging active involvement outside our walls and influencing others with Christ's love.
- Christian Education Partner: Maintain and promote Concordia's commitment to Christian education, including the partnerships with Christ Community Lutheran School (CCLS) and the Lutheran High School Association.
- **Personal Developer**: Be intentional about pursuing a personal development plan as it relates to you, your family and the staff you lead. This includes seeking pastoral mentorship beyond the congregation.
- LCMS Partnership: Maintain partnering relationship with the leadership and membership of the LCMS.

- A member in good standing on the clergy roster of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.
- Graduate of one of the Synod's seminaries with a Master of Divinity or higher degree.
- Parish ministry experience preferably including a large church with multiple staff.
- Demonstrates a growing relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Committed to personal growth, servant leadership, healthy relationships, and a healthy culture within the staff and Church Council.
- Team player with excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Outgoing and friendly, confident and transparent/down-to-earth.

- Progressive and result-oriented, a pioneer and achiever who is comfortable leading.

Our church doesn't have enough volunteers for that. Our church doesn't have enough space for that. Our church doesn't have enough funding for that. Our church just doesn't do that.

What each of these phrases really means: Your child with special needs is not welcome. Your family with special needs is not welcome.

The above phrases are unfortunately not hypothetical but real examples that individuals and families have shared with me regarding their experiences at different churches in our area.

Nearly two thousand years ago, the Son of God walked on this earth as a man and gave us very clear instructions on inclusion through his perfect words and actions. Love everyone. Make disciples of all nations. All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, yet all are equally deserving of God's grace and love and mercy.

It may seem nearly incomprehensible that churches today are still turning families away because they have children with special needs, but this is the reality that many families face in their own church homes. In fact, nearly 50% of special needs parents said they refrained from participating in a religious activity because their child was not included or welcome.

I am so very thankful that my own church home, Concordia, welcomes families with special needs with open arms and as equal members of the body of Christ. I am so very thankful.
