Honoring a Legacy

When the Next Step Project kicked off, we spoke about honoring Pastors Schoedel and Gundermann in the Center for Christian Education. As we are now unveiling the CCE, we add Pastor Seidler to that list. For **48** years, Concordia was led by one of these men. Through almost **2500** semons, Confession and Absolutions, and Lord Suppers, we learned what it means to be a child of God and serve Jesus Christ. For many, Concordia is the home of multiple generations of baptisms, Christian education, worship, Bible studies, marriages and finally funerals. We dedicate the CCE in honor of these men and theyr legacy: the leader, the shepherd and the visionary.

The Leader

Pastor Schoedel officially served Concordia from 1971-1991. Unofficially, he continues to mentor and encourage Concordia staff and called staff even today. Pastor Schoedel was known for being a great leader within Concordia and the LCMS at large. Under Pastor Schoedel, we expanded three times, revised our Governance structure and developed a strong staff. Pastor Schoedel originally brokered the relationship with the five congregations that created Christ Community Lutheran School (CCLS). That leadership resulted in our school today, CCLS, being one of the strongest in the Lutheran system with **651** children. After a conversation with Pastor Schoedel, you most certainly leave it feeling blessed and encouraged to serve.

The Shepherd

Pastor Vern Gundermann served from 1991–2005. Most cannot speak about Pastor Gunderman without mentioning what a wonderful shepherd he was to all in his presence. He brought us our Mission statement to "Touch People with Jesus Christ for Healing and for Service" and he led by example all whom he served. Even when he was ill with ALS and could no longer speak or write, he continued to send us devotions always focused on the greatness and blessings of God.

The Visionary

Pastor Seidler served Concordia from 2006–2019. He came to Concordia with the charge of taking us to the next level. In a time where most Christian churches are shrinking, Pastor Seidler moved us forward. With his gift for preaching and worship vision, our worship services became more diverse in style and improved excellence. The Center for Christian Education was originally the vision of Pastor Seidler, and certainly if not for his promoting that vision to Concordia, we would not be celebrating its opening today.

INBOUND FINANCIALS AS OF 7/31/2019

We've found that having a practice from 5:00-5:35pm has a challenge for families to get to Concordia on time, which has given us a very short time to work with the children before they meet for dinner. Stacy and I will be sending out a survey to all of our Concordia families with children in 2nd-5th grade to find out what other options may be more effective and practical. This certainly won't be the end of Kids Song, but rather a calibration to be sure we have a meeting time that helps us better accomplish the goal of preparing our kids to use their voices to lead in worship.

I can also remember going to Confirmation classes each Friday with Pastor Gundermann and Jeremy Becker. All this before there was a new Center for Christian Education. Before there was even a Concordia Center. Walls have come up and walls have come down. And now in the exact same place where my VBS class was taught and I gathered each week with my fellow CCLS 8th graders, I get the privilege of setting up a space dedicated specifically to serve our kiddos in the Special

Needs Ministry. How great is that? How great is God!



Now, as a result of this dedicated space, families who once would have been unable to even attempt coming to worship because the trip alone would have been too much for their child can now confidently attend knowing their child will be able to decompress and regulate their senses once they are here.

We have been working with a non-profit organization called The Synapsory to make this dream become a reality. Their mission is to help churches reach these families once deemed unreachable through the use of Sensory Rooms. On the side are some examples of the items that will be located inside our very own Special Needs Ministry Sensory Room–located in the old nursery in the Sanctuary Commons.

I encourage you to stop by and take a look as we make progress toward better meeting the physical and spiritual needs of everyone at Concordia!

After checking in at registration, each guest will be assigned an equally glamorously dressed buddy for the evening. From here, the honored guest and the buddy head to the red carpet where the paparazzi will be waiting, ready to clap and cheer. Parents and caregivers of the honored guests in attendance then head to their own party in our building while the honored guest along with their buddy make their way to the dance floor.
